ITEMS TO LEAVE AT HOME

Cooking appliances with exposed heating elements (specifics in LETU Student Handbook), weapons of any kind (guns, blades, swords, bows and arrows, darts, air soft guns, paintball guns, etc.), outside antennas or satellites, air conditioning units, halogen lamps, extension cords, multi-plug covers, both wireless and wired routers (switches are okay), wireless access points or air ports, questionable materials (printed or digital), traffic signs or other illegally-obtained signs or decorations, candles or incense, fireworks (or any other fire-related materials), pets (except fish in 10-gal aquariums or less), space heaters, nails, screws, permanent adhesives (anything that could damage walls), large furniture, large stereos, expensive equipment, or valuable jewelry.
